



WOMEN IN THE LEGISLATION OF THE PARTICIPATING COUNTRIES:

The search for legislative differences in the regulation of social, labor, civil and reproductive rights in relation to women is a task for **the 2018/2019** academic year.

Our proposal is to search by countries, information on the areas indicated below, paying special attention to the highlighted aspects:

1. Labor legislation and women:

1.1. Prohibition of access to certain professions:

- 1.1.1 Is there currently a prohibited profession for women?
- 1.1.2 What professions were prohibited for them?
- 1.1.3 In what year was free access achieved?

1.2. Necessity of permission of a man (father / husband) to access a job.

- 1.2.1 Have women needed male authorization to work at any time in history?
- 1.2.2 Whose (father, husband ...)
- 1.2.3 In some cases was it not necessary?
- 1.2.4 When was male permission to work no longer required?

2. Civil rights:

2.1-Right to vote

- 2.1.1 When did women obtain the right to vote?

2.2-Authorization to travel (have or not passport)

- 2.2.1 Women, could they travel autonomously? Could they have their own passport, or should they be included in the passport of a male family member?

2.3-Marriage / divorce

- 2.3.1 What is the most frequent marriage in your country, civil or religious?
- 2.3.2 Is it approved the divorce in your country? In your case, is it necessary to claim a reason to divorce?
- 2.3.3 If necessary, if the reason is conjugal infidelity, does it affect men in the same way as women at the time of divorce?
- 2.3.4 the above, does it have repercussions on the custody of the children, the allocation of housing and / or compensatory pensions?

3. Access to education:

3.1. Prohibition of access to Universities and / or technical schools.

- 3.1.1 When did women in your country get access to higher education?
- 3.1.2 What was the first faculty they could access? And the last to allow access?
- 3.1.3 After permitting the enrollment of women in these faculties, were there any restrictions for them in the use of rooms, classrooms, etc.?
- 3.1.4 In what year did all discriminations and restrictions end?

3.2. Segregation by sex. Different curriculum for boys and girls

- 3.2.1 Until when there were differences in your country between the boys 'and girls' curricula?
- 3.2.2 What were these differences?

4. Reproductive and sexual rights:
